

## **SEASONAL MEMORIALS**

---

The placement of flowers, plants and artificial flowers are as follows:

- ◆ Flags and markers placed to acknowledge military service may be kept at the burial plot year round.
- ◆ Seasonal memorials may be placed on burial plots from May 15th through October 15th.
- ◆ Winter memorials may be placed on burial plots from December 1st to March 1st.
- ◆ All flowers, plants, and artificial flowers must be placed in non-glass containers, in a plant stand or upon the concrete marker base.
- ◆ No separate concrete base or pad is permitted.
- ◆ Artificial flowers must be securely fastened to a stand or container.
- ◆ The City shall not be liable for items placed as memorials.
- ◆ The City shall have the authority to remove items not conforming to the Hanover City Cemetery Policy.

# HANOVER CEMETERY

The Hanover Cemetery was established and is continued upon land that was purchased from Richard and Johanna Saenger on July 19, 1900.



Lots shall be sold at rates decided upon by the Hanover City Council. If it is deemed advisable, the Hanover City Council may adjust prices accordingly. The rates and charges are reviewed annually by the City Council and will be set by resolution.

The rules and regulations for the Hanover Cemetery may be found within the Hanover Cemetery Policy located on the Hanover website or by requesting a copy at City Hall.

The City of Hanover sells only the exclusive right of burial in a specific grave space, or grave spaces, known as burial plots. The legal title to the land in the cemetery remains in the Hanover City Cemetery; and all grave spaces will be subject to the laws of the State of Minnesota relating to the exclusive right of burial and are subject to the rules, regulations, and fee schedule in effect at the time of interment.

Newly installed in Fall 2019, the Columbarium has 48 niches available with each niche able to hold two sets of cremains. Two additional columbarium structures are planned for the future.
